




College Prep Grade Point Average (GPA)

GPA is determined by grades earned in A-G classes taken in the last three years of high school (10th-12th grade):




How can you INCREASE your College Prep GPA?

High School Courses




Any identified H/AP/CL courses taken between 10th-12th grade receive 1+ GPA point when passed with a grade of "C" ↑



Exams: SAT

- ❖ 3 hour long exam
- ❖ Divided into 3 parts:
 - 1. Critical Reading
 - 2. Math
 - 3. Writing



❖ Scoring:

- Maximum score of 2400
- •Each section scored on a scale from 200-800
- - ¹/₄ point for every incorrect answer

❖ <u>Cost</u>: \$49





Exams: ACT with Writing

- Divided into 5 parts
 - 1. English
 - 2. Math
 - 3. Social Science
 - 4. Science
 - 5. Writing Section*
- Scoring
 - 1-36 points per section
 - Maximum composite score of 36
 - No penalty for incorrect answers

- All achievements are considered in the context of the opportunities the applicant had. Strength of high school curriculum, # of H/AP and "a-g" courses available among other indicators are factors that are considered during the evaluation process.

Personal Achievements

AB-540 Students

AB-540 Students Qualify for IN STATE TUITION if:

- 1. Attended California High School for at least 3 years (6 semesters)
- 2. Graduate with Diploma or GED
- 3. Enroll in a college
- 4. Submit AB-540 Affidavit with college

Does **NOT** qualify for:

- Federal or state Financial Aid- No FAFSA application needed
- Residency or paths to residency
- Permit to work

AB-130

Signed into law July 25, 2011, authorizes AB540 students to apply to privately funded scholarships given out by a California public college/university. Effective January 1, 2012

REQUIREMENTS TO QUALIFY:

1.Be Classified as AB540
2.Meet each scholarship's requirements
(this will be implemented by campus)

AB-131

Signed into law Oct. 8, 2011, authorizes AB540 students to apply for Board of Governor's Fee Waiver and Cal Grants

REQUIREMENTS TO QUALIFY:

- 1. Be Eligible for AB540
- 2. GPA and income requirements as decided by the California Aid Commission
